Penalty for False Information

If you qualify for State student financial assistance by purposely reporting false or misleading information, you shall be guilty of a crime of the fourth degree.

According to N.J.S.A. 52:18A-240 the Schools Development Authority (SDA) must set aside a portion of its construction contracts' revenue to train women and minority group members in construction trade occupations. Hence, to be eligible for the NJ-GIVS program, as it is funded through these "set aside" funds, recipients must be women or members of minority groups. As defined at N.J.A.C. 17:46-1.2 "'Minority' means a person who is: 1) Black, which is a person having origins in any of the black racial groups in Africa; or 2) Hispanic, which is a person of Spanish or Portuguese culture, with origins in Mexico, South or Central America, or the Caribbean Islands, regardless of race; or 3) Asian American, which is a person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, Indian Subcontinent, Hawaii or the Pacific Islands; or 4) American Indian or Alaskan native, which is a person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America."
